DIRECTIVE RELATING TO REGULATIONS ISSUED IN TERMS OF SECTION 27(2) OF THE DISASTER MANAGEMENT ACT, 2002: ALERT LEVEL 4: FIREARMS, LIQUOR AND SECOND-HAND GOODS

- The Minister of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs has declared 1. a national State of Disaster in response to the COVID-19 threat by issuing Regulations in terms of Section 27(2) of the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act No. 57 of 2002), hereafter referred to as the "Regulations", promulgated in Regulation Gazette No. 11098, dated 29 April 2020. A copy of the Regulations is attached for ease of reference, as per Annexure "A".
- The Regulations, inter alia, introduces Alert Level 4 which was implemented 2. on 1 May 2020 (see Table 1 to the Regulations: Permissions and Prohibitions).
- The purpose of this directive is to provide guidance to all Designated Police 3. Officials (DPO's) in the firearms, liquor and second-hand goods (FLASH) environment in relation to the provisions as contained in the Regulation as it relates to the FLASH environment.
- Permissions and Prohibitions: Alert Level 4 4.
- In terms of Table 1 to the Regulations, certain permissions and prohibitions 4.1 were declared, which have an impact on certain businesses in the FLASH environment.
- The following guidance in relation to the type of business, type of goods and 4.2 restrictions applicable on such businesses (if any) will be provided:
- 4.2.1 Firearms Environment (Explanation of Table 1 of the Regulations in relation to the firearms environment)

GENERAL NOTES:1) The following types of second-hand goods dealers are <u>not allowed</u> to operate during Alert Level Status 4:

- Pawn Brokers;
- Flea Markets; and
- Jewellers.
- 2) All types of second-hand goods dealers that are allowed to operate during Alert Level Status 4, as set out above, will only be allowed to operate under the provisions of Regulation 28(1) to (4) as well as the conditions of registration as a second-hand goods dealer.
- 3) Transgressions in the second-hand goods environment will mostly be relevant to the contraventions of Regulation 16(1) and/or 16(2), read with Regulation 31(2), and will include transgressions by secondhand goods dealers as well as clients.
- 4) New applications for the Registration as a Second-Hand Goods Dealer for the categories of second-hand goods dealers that is allowed to operate under Alert Level Status 4, as set out above, must be accepted and processed. New applications for the Registration as a Second-Hand Goods Dealer of categories of second-hand goods dealers not resorting under Alert Level Status 4, must not be accepted or processed at this time.
- 5) Renewal applications for the Renewal of Registration as a Second-Hand Goods Dealer, for the categories of second-hand goods dealers allowed to operate under Alert Level Status 4, as set out above, must be accepted and processed. Renewal applications for the Renewal of Registration as a Second-Hand Goods Dealer of categories of second-hand goods dealers that does not resort under Alert Level Status 4, must not be accepted or processed at this time.



- 6) All applications for Written Representations, Extension of Time, Condonation or Appeals within the second-hand goods environment must be accepted and processed.
- All functions related to Accredited Second-Hand Goods Dealers' Associations must continue.

5. "Permits" to perform work as an essential service provider

- 5.1 A Certificate of Record, also referred to as a "CIPC Certificate" (example attached as per **Annexure** "B"), is issued by the Commissioner of Companies and Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC), to a company/business to confirm the following:
 - that the said company/business is registered in terms of the Companies Act, 2008; and
 - that the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) has received an application from such company/business to perform essential services under the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act No. 57 of 2002).
- 5.2 It is important for DPO's to note that the CIPC Certificate is not a requirement in terms of the Regulations and in itself **does not** grant permission to a company/business to operate as an essential service during the Alert Level 4 period. The possession of the CIPC Certificate is still subject to the company/business fully complying with the applicable Alert Level 4 Regulations.
- 5.3 DPO's are encouraged to familiarise themselves with the content of the Regulations and this guideline in order to determine whether a business may operate as an essential service provider during compliance inspections.

6. Offences and penalties

- 6.1 In terms of Regulation 31(1)(a) and (b), any person who, for the duration of the national state of disaster is guilty of an offence and on conviction, liable to a fine or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment if such person-
 - · convenes a gathering; or
 - hinders, interferes with, or obstructs an enforcement officer in the exercise of his her powers, or the performance of his or her duties in terms of the Regulations.
- 6.2 In terms of Regulation 31(2), any person who fails to comply with or contravenes the provisions of regulations 16(1), 16(2), 16(3) and 16(4), 19, 24(1) and 24(2), 26(1) and 26(2), 27 and 28(3) commits and offence and is,

on conviction, liable to a fine or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

- 6.3 Offences applicable to the Regulations are attached as per **Annexure** "C" and a guideline to be followed in circumstances when the Regulations are contravened is attached as per **Annexure** "D".
- 7. With the lowering of each Alert Level Status it is expected that more businesses within the FLASH environment will be granted permission to reenter the workforce which will place an additional strain on SAPS to monitor not only compliance to the applicable legislation but also to the Regulations. Provincial Commissioners are kindly requested to ensure the optimal functioning of the FLASH environment at station level.
